




Protection Projects

About the Programme

FHD prioritizes protection projects as one of its main areas of focus, as it seeks to improve the lives of women, girls, children, and their affected families, as well as contribute to their protection from various forms of abuse, neglect, exploitation, and violence, especially amidst current Yemen's emergency situation. This is accomplished by providing an integrated package of preventive and curative interventions aimed at the most vulnerable populations, namely the IDPs and their host communities.



Enhanced Protection Project for the vulnerable women and girls

The project's objective is to safeguard the most vulnerable groups of women and girls by giving them safe ways to make money, enhancing their life skills, and teaching them trades that will enable them to support their families and overcome obstacles in life.

Child-Friendly Space Activity

This activity aims to enhance the protection and psychosocial well-being of children by providing a safe environment where they can develop life and educational skills. It also offers recreational and awareness-raising activities that help build self-confidence, support emotional recovery from crises, and strengthen their ability to cope with challenging life circumstances.

Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) Activity

This activity aims to raise community awareness about the dangers of female genital mutilation (FGM) and its psychological, physical, and social consequences, emphasizing that it is a violation of girls rights. Awareness sessions target families, local and religious leaders, as well as women and girls, focusing on correcting misconceptions and promoting healthy, culturally sensitive alternatives to help reduce the prevalence of this practice.

About the Programme

FHD places a high value on the Health and Nutrition programme as one of its top priorities in humanitarian response and sustainable development. Given Yemen's deteriorating health condition as a result of the prolonged conflict, as well as the healthcare system's fragility and as part of its humanitarian commitment, the FHD has implemented a number of projects to improve health services, such as the rehabilitation, equipping, and operation of health centers, the distribution of medicines and basic medical supplies, and the provision of reproductive health services and maternal care.



Sustainable, High-Quality Service Project for Pregnant Women and Newborns

The objective of this project is to address the pressing need for basic health services by enhancing the quality of treatment provided to expectant mothers and babies in five health centers located in the Hodeidah governorate, Hays district, Al Khawkha, Taiz governorate, Mokha district, Dhubab, and Mawza'a. As part of the Project, medical equipment are provided for the facilities, medical personnel and operating expenses are covered, and medical staff capabilities are built in order to ensure continued and high-quality healthcare services.

About the Programme

To change women's lives and increase their contribution to economic and social development, FHD has worked through economic empowerment projects to give them access to economic opportunities, increase financial literacy, and give them the training they need to become empowered in a range of fields. In an effort to make gender economic equality a key component of sustainable development, the FHD is keen to keep funding initiatives and programmes that increase women's economic empowerment.



Economic empowerment of women and girls (as part of the Protection and Livelihood Support Project for Women and Girls)

The goal of the training and economic empowerment program is to enable women on both an economic and social level, helping them to become financially independent and enhancing their families' quality of life. In addition to receiving training in many fields, women are also given the resources and equipment necessary to launch their own businesses, which enhances their employment opportunities and income.

About the Programme

FHD prioritizes education and attempts to reduce school dropout rates by offering educational opportunities for children affected by displacement and violence. To ensure that education reaches children and leads to a better future, the FHD builds and renovates schools, provides school supplies, trains and offers teachers' salaries, and provides solar energy systems and educational supplies.



Enhanced educational environment project for the vulnerable school-age children in crisisaffected schools

The project contributed with offering conductive educational environment in six schools within the target district by renovating and rehabilitating three schools, providing monthly incentives to teachers and volunteers amid public salary disruptions, and providing students with recreational and school bags to prevent dropping outs.

About the Programme

FHD prioritizes WASH as critical pillars of sustainable development. It recognizes that providing clean water and sanitation is critical to individual and community health, as well as their role in fostering social and economic justice. As part of this commitment, FDH has undertaken a number of programmes focused at increasing access to clean water in locations facing great needs for such services.



Rehabilitation of Beit Bish Water Well and its Facilities

By renovating the Beit Bish water well and its facilities—which will include supplying and installing a solar energy system, a pumping line, building a tank with two towers, and installing a pipeline network—the project aims to provide safe drinking water and shield the community from the spread of diseases and malnutrition brought on by contaminated water, open swamps, and mosquitoes.

About the programme

The continued conflict has made housing displaced persons in difficult humanitarian situations a top concern for FHD. After being compelled to live in camps without even the most basic amenities, hundreds of thousands of families are left vulnerable to the extreme weather and lack of clothes, which further exacerbates their suffering. In accordance with its humanitarian mission, the FHD conducted a variety of shelter-related interventions, including offering safe shelters and distributing relief items like clothing and blankets, in an effort to alleviate the suffering of IDP families and enhance their living standard.



Relief Project for Flood-Affected People

To help those affected by the floods and rainfall in the Hodeidah Governorate, the FHD started a relief operation. In addition to improving living conditions and helping affected families rebuild their lives, this initiative, which is a part of the FHD's efforts to lessen the suffering of the community's most vulnerable groups, aims to provide them with immediate and comprehensive support by distributing blankets, mats, kitchen utensils, and integrated shelter baskets.

About the programme

Given the severity of the problems facing impacted communities, FHD is keen to enhance food security in Yemen. The FHD is working tirelessly, in partnership with international, regional, and local organizations, to help lessen the severity of the food crisis and ease the suffering of the most vulnerable groups in light of the ongoing economic crisis and the unpredictability of humanitarian aid. This is done by giving food assistance to the most vulnerable families and cash assistance to allow households to buy the food they need.



Project to Provide Emergency Assistance for People Affected by Yemen's Floods and Rainfall in 2024

FHD has started a relief effort aimed at people in the Hodeidah Governorate who have been impacted by the extreme weather and floods. Through the provision of food assistance, the project seeks to provide affected families with immediate and inclusive support. This initiative, which is part of the FHD's efforts, aims to alleviate the suffering and improve the living conditions of the affected people and assist them to rebuild their lives.
