
## 16 Days campaign Against Genderbased Violence


The Foundation implemented many activities and events during the days of the 16 Days

## **Success Stories**









## I started sewing with needle and thread

We slept on the floor and went for days without eating. My husband was tired for looking for a job. I was depressed because I couldn't do anything to help him.

Khadija, 32 years old, is married and has children. She lives in a camp for the Refugees in Seiyun. She says, "Our situation was very difficult. We lived in a place where the most basic necessities of life are not available".

The project to improve protection interventions through training of sewing skills in income-generating projects implemented by the "For Human Development Foundation".

Khadija was one of the 60 trainees in the project who were trained in design and sewing skills.

Khadija says after the end of the training period, "I started designing some clothes for children, and it started to generate a decent income for me, even though I don't have a sewing machine at home, but I cut the fabric and start sewing it with my own hands by needles and threads. And I finish sewing with one of my neighbors who owns the machine". Khadija is among the distinguished among her colleagues in designing children's clothing. And this matter made her more confident and aspire in the future to have her own sewing lab.







#### Reem breathes Life

During her school exam, one of her classmates asked her to help her. The teacher saw her and rushed to beat and publicize her in front the public. She couldn't stand what happened to her, so she was psychologically shocked, which made her go into convulsive fits and became more aggressive and withdrawn.

Reem, 21 years old, married a man much older than her after her father forced her to marry in order to solve her problem. One month until she came back with her divorce paper, which made her condition worse.

During the arrival of the access team of the Safe Space Project implemented by the "For Human Development Foundation and supported by the United Nations Population Fund, Reem was identified and taken to provide appropriate support for her case.

Reem traveled to Aden with her father to receive treatment and was presented to specialists who stressed the need for rapid intervention to help her get out of her condition. And so she was treated and taken care of. Reem returned home with her father, and the effects of the improvement began to appear on her, and the seizures stopped too. Her family says that Reem has improved after the treatment and has become normal. She laughs and sits with us and we talk about her when she was spending most her time alone.





## With god willing, I will increase my sheep from ten to twenty

She assumed responsibility for her children, raising them and providing them with a livelihood. She used to work as a house cleaner to meet their needs

Samia is a forty-year-old widow and mother of six children. She aspired for her children to complete their education and have a place in society. One day, she attended one of the awareness sessions carried out by the field access team in different areas of the city of Al-khokha She got acquainted with the services provided by the Safe Space Project implemented by the "For Human Development Foundation" .with the support of the United Nations Population Fund She was included in the Training and Economic Empowerment Program, through which she received life skills training. She was also included in the livestock breeding program and was granted five livestock as an income-generating economic project for her and her

Now, after seven months of the grant, the number of Semitic cattle has become 12, and she sold one of them for one hundred thousand Riyals. Samia says, "by God willing, my sheep will increase, and instead of ten there will be a twenty. I will have a sheep farm and ."provide for myself and my kids







#### The project had a significant role in improving my condition

Ahlam, a 36-year-old mother of seven. She lost her husband as a result of the war and took responsibility for her children's upbringing, especially

her 6-year-old daughter who suffers from Down syndrome.

Ahlam says, "I was suffering from constant insomnia after my husband's death. I had to move with my children to Seiyun and work there on a farm all

day in the summer heat. My eldest son also left school to help me."

Ahlam met with a member of the "Foe Human" team of the project to Improve Protection Interventions during the field visits and the distribution of registration forms for sewing courses. She was accepted as one of the trainees in the project. She says, "I was very happy that I would be trained in sewing and acquire a new profession that would generate

income for me and suit me as a woman."

The project had a significant impact on changing the situation of her and her children. Ahlam says, "I left the hard work of picking crops and working from home sewing, and my son went back to school."







## After training, I was able to secure a source of income

Her family's abuse of her and their attempt to force her into a second marriage, thus began the suffering of the 22-year-old widow, Manar After the death of her first husband, Manar and her child moved to live with her family in a Refugee camp. Manar says, "I was in pain as I looked at my three-year-old child sleeping on a worn out mat, and I was unable to find a source of income that would provide us with the most basic necessities of life. In addition to my family's harassment and forcing me to accept any marriage proposal to get

".rid of my responsibility for me and my child

Manar tells, "I watched the foundation's announcement of the sewing training project, so I went to their headquarters and registered and was accepted. And I was very keen to understand and

".apply all the lessons in order to benefit

After the training ended, I saved some money and bought a sewing machine and worked on it by sewing and selling shirts, robes and dresses. After I had a source of income, I was able to provide for my needs and the needs of my child. And my family's look about me ".improved and they accepted my presence



## Courses

#### Training course for employees entitled "Basics of Monitoring and Evaluation"



The course included many important topics such as basic concepts in Monitoring and Evaluation, methods of measuring results related to projects, how to develop a Monitoring and Evaluation plan, knowledge of Monitoring Evaluation indicators, and the mechanism of data collection and report writing.

The course included many practical activities and workshops.

This comes within the many training programs that the foundation holds for its employees to raise efficiency and effectiveness and to achieve better performance.

### Qualification course for water and sanitation project staff

"For Human Development Foundation" conducted a 5-day course for the staff of the project to provide an integrated and life-saving response in the field of water, sanitation and hygiene.

The course aimed to qualify 10 project employees before starting it on the work mechanism in all its parts and to familiarize them with the project plan and the activities it will present.

It also provided them with an overview of all the foundation's work manuals and regulations. The Foundation is keen to implement these refresher and rehabilitation sessions for employees to ensure their start to work.


