






Objectives


Relations and partnerships

Security and
Malnutrition
Program
(cash for
work)

Funded by the German agency GIZ in the framework of the Food Security, nutrition program and enhancing the resilience of local communities, FHD has implemented cash for work project in Al-Qafr district, Ibb governorate.

The project aimed at enhancing resilience of local communities exposed to malnutrition and food insecurity via conducting a cash vs. work methodology by employing dwellers of the region to work on the project for a monthly salary that contributes in achieving food security for beneficiaries during the project implementation period.

Total of families benefited from salaries reached 80.



A water cistern was constructed at Bani Quryia village to collect the water of Al-Muain spring, which in turn helped to provide residents with clean drinking water, especially in winter where the water is scarce and difficult for the villagers to obtain except by paying a high price.

Bani Mahdi and Al-Fadhiya road, which is more than 600m length, was also rehabilitated and paved in addition to constructing more than 12 supporting walls along many sections of the road.

The project of providing primary healthcare services and treating cases of malnourished children under 5 year old and PLWs

FHD has implemented a project addressing cases of malnutrition in Jabal Habashi district of Taiz governorate, by launching a mobile medical clinic and two fixed clinics in two health facilities accompanying with a team of volunteers to reach the targeted group of children, pregnant women, and breast-feeding mothers who are suffering from malnutrition and cannot obtain healthcare and treatment services.

The project examined approximately (8,282) cases of children and (3,626) of pregnant and breast-feeding mothers and provided healthcare services to (5,707) other cases of men, women and children.

Furthermore, 840 children with severe acute malnutrition were accepted on the program to be followed-up and nutritionally treated. The project is still treating children to reach the desired goal until February of 2020.






Community Leaders Workshop

An introductory workshop for the project was implemented in the presence of the project's staff and a number of community committee leaders and representatives of the health office in the directorate to enlighten them about the foundation and what the health services to be provided by the project to the targeted group.

Volunteer training course

A training course was held for female volunteers to train them about mechanisms of examining children and women by measuring MAUC and the weight to diagnose cases of malnutrition to normal, severe and acute, and how to refer them to health centers. They were also trained on methods of delivering awareness messages to mothers.





Projects to enhance food security for affected communities and the displaced

Within the framework of humanitarian relief projects implemented by the FHD and within the campaign of charitable projects of FBS and Muslim Relief, the FHD has distributed 66 food baskets to poor and displaced families.

Flood affected relief project



In late July of 2019, FHD targeted those affected by severe flooding in Abs district of Hajjah governorate by conducting a relief project that included distribution of food and shelter materials to the affected families.

FHD Foundation has contributed to the relief of IDPs in Hajjah governorate by conducting a project to distribute 750 food baskets to IDPs families.

Studies and Field Surveys

66 Believing in the importance of studies and field surveys in determining humanitarian needs, FHD has done a set of need studies in multiple sectors, so that its interventions to be based on precise and accurate information reflecting the reality, which in turn contributes in achieving the best results.

Rapid Gender-based needs assessment (GBV)

FHD has conducted a gender-based field survey in Thee Safal and Al-Dhahran districts of 1bb governorate aiming to collect accurate information about of conflict in Yemen on the impact both women and girls in particular and determine the essential needs that will help in recovering from the effects of armed conflict, through studying their life conditions, the problems they have been faced, their roles and wills.

The field survey was carried out by a specialized team, using several methods such as personal interviews and group discussions, in which the participants were carefully chosen by the team, in order to be representative of the targeted community.

After collecting and processing the data, the field survey report and its results were issued. It showed many general problems caused by the conflict that society as a whole suffers from, such as difficult living conditions and the scarcity of basic services, while the results of the gender-based survey showed the presence of violence cases against women and girls; the highest rate of domestic violence, followed by sexual harassment and physical, psychological and emotional violence, in addition to the low rates of protection services provided to women and girls.



It is worth mentioning that women and girls dwelling in conflict areas and displacement camps in Yemen lack protection services, including psychological and legal support, health and education services and empowerment which are very important in conditions of war and conflict.



Assessment of needs in (WASH)

FHD has worked to estimate water, sanitation and hygiene needs in the Al-Mashanah district of lbb governorate, by conducting a field survey on a randomly chosen community of 350 families, and two focus group discussions (FGD) were held for the community leaders in the region.

After issuance of the results of the study, it showed the dire need for clean drinking water, and the need for waste containers and hygiene bags that may contribute to reduce spreading of infectious diseases and epidemics such as cholera and dengue fever.

Within the framework of the project of addressing cases of malnutrition, FHD has conducted a field survey, in Jabal Habashi of Taiz governorate, to evaluate knowledge attitudes and practices (KAP) related to nutrition of children and pregnant mothers before launching the project. The survey aimed to form a starting point for implementing all activities in the project depending on its results in selecting and designing the quality and methods of those activities.

The survey was conducted using the random selection method, after dividing the target area into ten main sections in which ten female volunteers distribute questionnaires and supervise their filling and recollecting. After processing data, the results of the survey were issued in several fields; undernourishment, feeding children under five years and food safety and others.

Taking part on Events and Conferences

FHD undoubtedly moves within the framework of a society in which it is fully integrated and participates whenever it has an opportunity in the activities, events and conferences held by the actors in the field of joint humanitarian work.






Electronic media campaign on the occasion of International Women's Day


Complaints and suggestions Manual

From the top of Jabal Habashi district in Taizz governorate, FHD team of the project of providing primary health services and addressing malnutrition for children and pregnant mothers, succeeded on saving lives of one thousand children from the specter of deadly malnutrition that is targeting their lives one by one.

The rough road and the far-distances between residents' houses deterred

of

-one of the mothers whose child survived a malnutrition, she said "My daughter was suffering from frequent inflammation, severe immune deficiency, and severely underweight which banned her from walking."

"I used to take my daughter to clinic frequently, twice a month, but after arrival

of FHD team to my

house. thev examined her, provided her with necessary nutritional treatments, and learned me awareness οf nutrition methods and hygiene. After that, I noticed great recovery on Reham's health and immunity

she started eating normally like her brothers. What is more beautiful is that she is again able to stand and walk after we have lost hope and thought she was disabled," she added. Now, 155,000 child enjoys a healthy life after few months of FHD positive project intervention in their lives, which restored the smile and hope to them and their families
