Introduction

Yemen suffers from a significant and escalating deterioration in the economic and humanitarian situation, successive crises and continuing wars have overshadowed by its grim shadow and negative repercussions on this afflicted country which most of whose inhabitants lack the most basic living services, and face great challenges and serious difficulties in accessing clean water, food and various life services.

UN and international reports show that the war in Yemen for three years has caused some 22 million people to be in humanitarian need, and the majority of the population also suffers from food insecurity due to the persistent shortage of essential foodstuffs, clean drinking water, the mounting decline in primary health care services and the lack of sanitation services.

These reports also confirm that more than 10 million people are on the brink of starvation, and that severe acute malnutrition (SAM) threatens the lives of some 400,000 children, the World Food Program (WFP) estimates that some 150,000 children suffering from malnutrition may die in the next few years.

In the context of this report, we bring to the hands of insiders and surfers the projects, programs and services implemented by the Forhuman Development Foundation in 2017. The Foundation has provided relief, developmental, health, social and educational projects, programs and services, training and rehabilitation programs, awareness-raising, education and motivation in various fields. That due to its national and humanitarian duty, to achieve its goals, vision and mission, and to contribute to the overall development and fighting against poverty in Yemen.

Partners



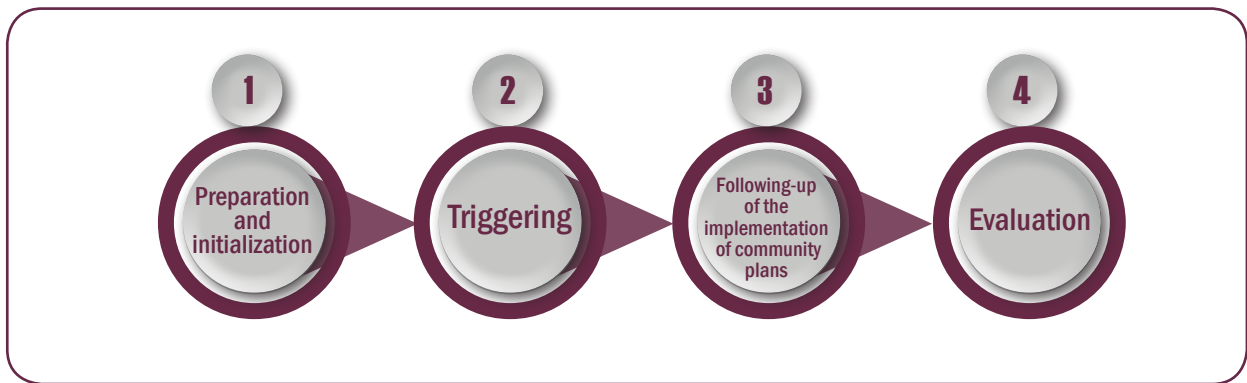

Accomplished Projects in 2017

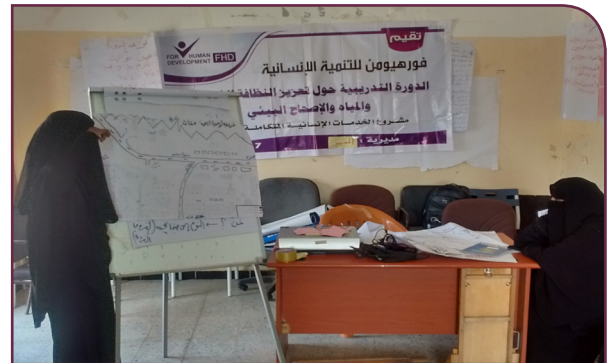
Environmental sanitation project in rural communities

In 2017, FHD launched a Community Lead Total Sanitation project (CLTS) as part of its implementation of the project to Provide Multisectoral Aid for Communities that have been Suffering of Malnutrition in partnership with CSSW and support of OCHA, through which we targeted populations that have been suffering from the phenomenon of open defecation and uncovered sewerage of human's remnants in 120 villages of Lahj governorate (Al-Milah, Al-Musaimeer districts). Preceding the implementation of the project, training programs for health workers and volunteers were implemented on the CLTS.

The project was implemented in four phases:



Community Lead Total Sanitation project (CLTS)

Natural leaders in the local community



course on promotion of Hygiene -Al-Milah

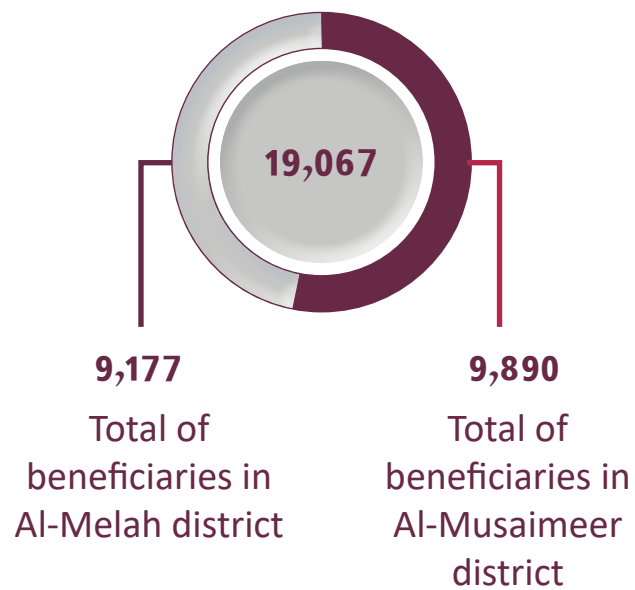
Awareness-raising and education activities have also been conducted, through home visits, sensitization sessions, and the distribution of project guidelines, as these activities contributed to the sensitization of the members and leaders of the districts' population.

Also creates a spirit of excitement and motivation and encourage them to begin analyzing the status of Total Sanitation in their villages, with the aim of taking collective decisions, to change wrong behaviors and to eliminate the phenomenon of open defecation and uncovered sewerage of human's remnants.

Emergency intervention Project to treat cases of malnutrition

Implemented by FHD through 2016 and 2017 with aim of saving the lives of thousands of children under the age of five, lactating mothers and pregnant women from the risk MAM and SAM. FHD has conducted mobile medical teams, targeting disadvantaged populations in the neediest districts in Taiz(Shar'ab Al-Rawna and Shar'ab Al-Salam) and Al-Mahwit(Al-Tawela).



Implemented Activities during the project

Through the project, FHD treated 9390 cases of malnutrition among children, lactating mothers and pregnant women, and improved their health and nutritional status. Also 143720 individuals benefited from the indirect project services such as carrying out awareness and education campaigns for the communities in the target areas about the basics of healthy nutrition, the risks of malnutrition and prevention mechanisms. Furthermore, there was specialized clinic providing the care of pregnant and lactating women by a qualified midwife.

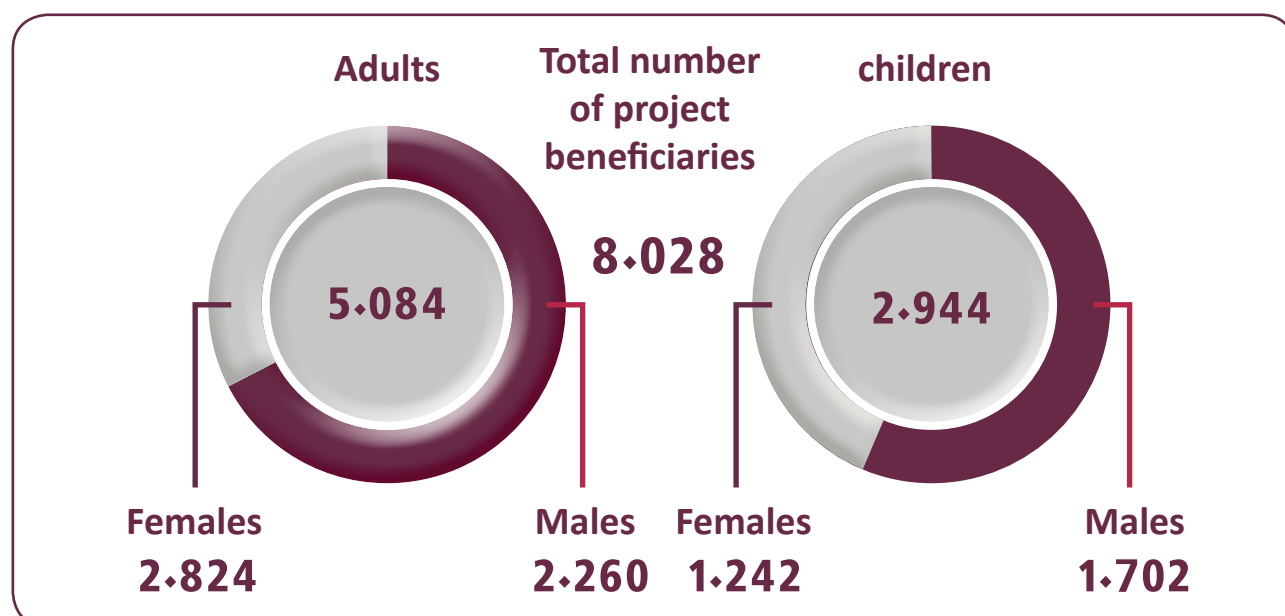

Implemented Activities during the project

Reproductive health Program

Implemented by FHD under the « Safe motherhood and family planning voucher distribution program» in cooperation with the YAMAN Organization for Health and Social Development (funded by the German Development Agency). Through the program, FHD distributed health vouchers for safe motherhood and family planning for about 2100 families in the Jebbla district, Ibb.



Implemented Activities during the project

The goal of the project is to raise the rate of use of reproductive health and family planning services. The program has contributed to improving the physical, social and economic well-being of women, men and youth who are targeted, through which the necessary care and family planning services have been provided to targeted women During pregnancy and after childbirth.

Distributing utensils and sanitary tools for transporting and conserving water

Through its fight against cholera and prevention of it, by supporting and funding from UNHCR, FHD has distributed utensils and sanitary tools for transporting and conserving water for 1,600 families in Jebbla District, Ibb. The project has contributed to reducing the spread of cholera, which is usually carried through contaminated water. The total number of beneficiaries from the project is 11,200.

Social and educational sponsorship

Forhuman pays great interest to social and educational sponsorship, with the monthly sponsorship program for thousands of orphans, poor families and others in need with support from Qatar Charity (QC). Until the end of 2017 FHD provided 6236 different sponsorships for poor families, orphans, disabled, students and teachers in a number of governorates of the Republic, in cooperation and partnership with many organizations and donors.

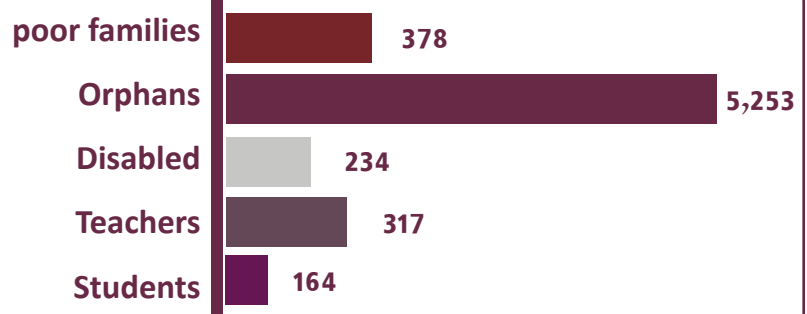
Through the monthly sponsorship program, Forhuman provides and disburses cash allotments to people who registered in the program, distributes Eid and winter clothes, distributes school bag, cares of creatives and innovates of education.
