



2. Emergency Response and Relief Programmes

These programmes seek to provide immediate support to affected individuals by giving food, health care, clean water, and shelter to displaced and disadvantaged communities. FHD administers these projects to alleviate suffering, particularly among the most vulnerable groups, such as children and women, and to help improve the everyday living conditions of those afflicted in remote areas.

One of the most crucial projects that the FHD works on is the Protection Project, which, by offering a package of preventive and curative interventions, improves the lives of women and girls, their families, and the communities that are impacted. About the Health and Nutrition Programme

Since the basic medical services offered in Yemen are still scarce and fall short of international health standards, the conflict has made health issues worse and resulted in poor management and response to the healthcare sector. Yemen is one of the nations that suffers the most from this sector. Therefore, FHD has endeavored to address certain health needs by establishing mobile and fixed clinics, as well as health counseling services for pregnant and lactating mothers in addition to rehabilitating and furnishing certain medical facilities.

About the Camp and Shelter Management Programme

According to United Nations reports, Yemen is experiencing the worst humanitarian crisis in the world, creating a horrible humanitarian situation. Hundreds of thousands of Yemeni families are living in hard humanitarian conditions, poverty, displacement, and ongoing suffering that gets worse and worse over time, leaving thousands of families living in the open without the most basic services, leaving them vulnerable to cold-related diseases, particularly among the elderly, women, and children. The FHD however was keen to support many households by providing essential shelter supplies to families and IDPs that meet their basic needs for a dignified life during such cold weather.



About the Water and Environmental Sanitation Programme

Yemen lacks the infrastructure needed to properly treat and distribute water, and there is a severe shortage of safe drinking water. This raises the prevalence of diseases linked to water and has a detrimental impact on public health. Owing to its significance, the FHD has been committed to restoring irrigation networks and wells to slow the spread of infectious diseases and to enhancing water supplies for impacted populations' access to sanitary facilities and clean water sources.
